Well done Year 9 and the staff who are supporting them!

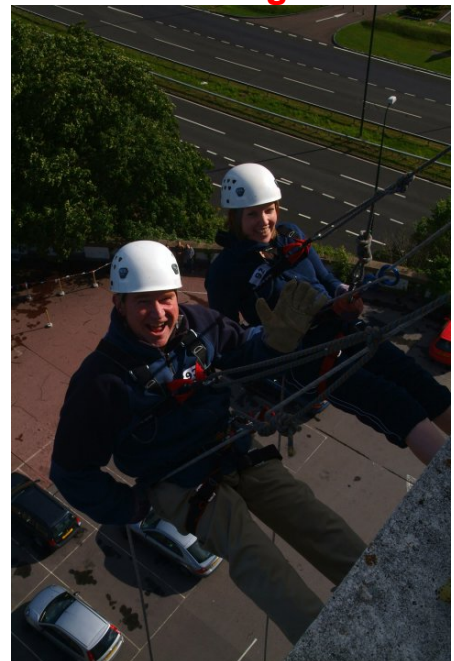
