The volunteer programme is ready to receive it's first volunteers. We would like to send a small group out to Moi's Bridge later this year. This would test the infrastructure we have put in place. The volunteers would be working with the school and local community. The work will enrich the lives of vulnerable children, many of whom are orphans. When circumstances change we will be extending this programme back into Zimbabwe where the majority of our work is.



The volunteer accommodation has four bedrooms, a living room and kitchen. It is 10 minutes walk from the Waymarks Education Centre. It is there that volunteers could support the dedicated staff, who work with the children there. There are other community projects just waiting for volunteers.
