### **Moi's Bridge in Kenya. The Waymarks Education Centre**

We have been lucky enough to buy an acre of land very near to the existing site. The present rented site is 50 feet x 100 feet and with no room to expand. The classroom we built last year filled all the remaining available space.

The local Education Officer has voiced concern about the poor accommodation. This new land will enable the centre, with help from Aid2Africa, to relocate onto a much larger site with an option to buy an adjacent acre of land in the future.

This will be the base for our volunteer programme.
